Other business: Stamps are needed for the newsletter and a roll of stamps was donated.

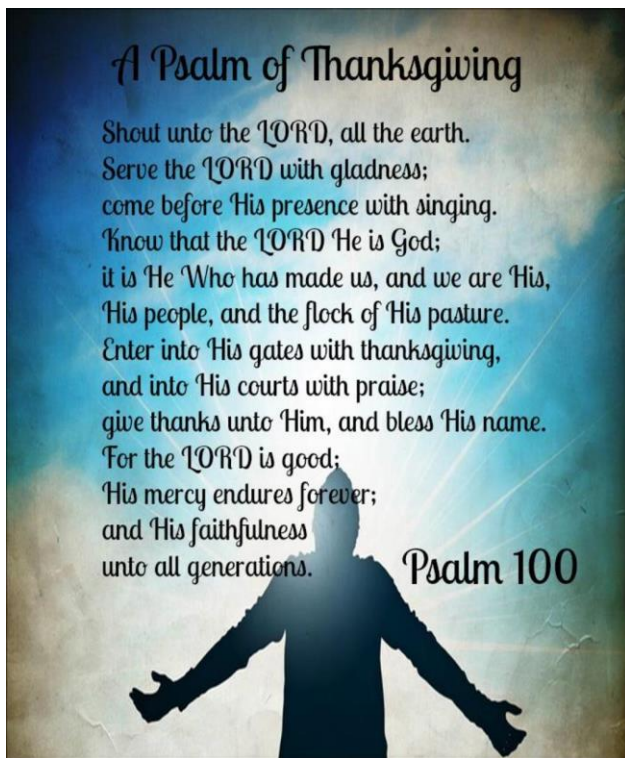
